Shannon knew if she did not leave the gang she could lose her kids and her life. In 2008 Shannon chose to leave her kids' father and move in with her mother.

After she and her kids moved in, she was sober and was working and starting to get on her feet. Sadly then their house caught on fire. To make matters worse, she then lost her job. With the problems mounting, she returned to drugs then lost custody of her kids.

After losing custody of her kids, she started to shoot up. This was the bottom so she knew she had to change her life. She checked herself into a recovery center.

Recovery was difficult and she had a tough time with following all the rules, but things turned around when she fully surrendered her life to Jesus Christ! Her Bible showed her that the only way to restore her health and family was to work the program with respect and integrity.

Shannon began a new relationship with her children. She graduated from the recovery center and became an intern there. Though she was successful in the program and was quickly accomplishing her goals, the court still extended her kids' stay with their foster family for another year. This news discouraged Shannon so much that she quit calling her children and started spending her money loosely. When the foster parents saw she wasn't calling the kids, they referred her to another program, His House Outreach Ministries.

Today Shannon has received full custody of all five children, and is living in a family home. She is employed with a local Claremore law firm. She is a busy mom but her family is united and thriving!
